

## "Queen's Trust Scholarship Winner"

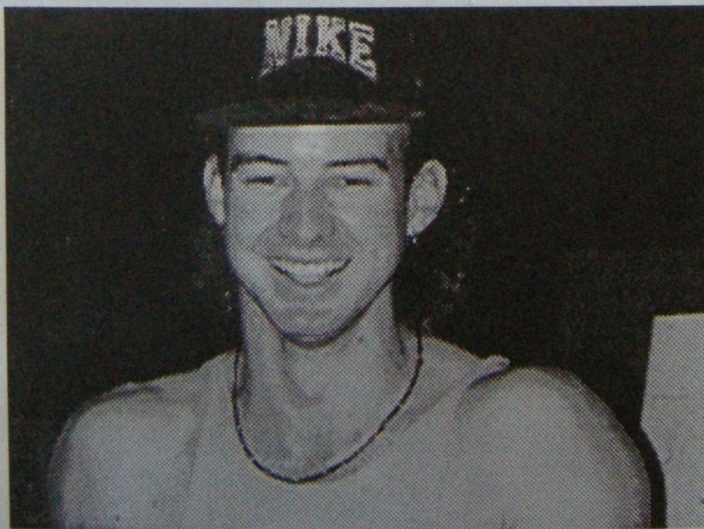
Every year, talented individuals displaying outstanding achievements and a pursuit of excellence in their chosen field are granted scholarships from The Queen's Trust. These grants aim to provide opportunities for young people in the 18 - 28 age group which would otherwise not be available, and encourage them to pursue their interests and further develop their skills.

We are delighted to report that former WorkSkill Olympian in Cabinetmaking, Scott Zeller, has won a coveted Queen's Trust Scholarship and will be travelling to Florence later this year to learn the ancient art of gilding.

Scott is one of WorkSkill's success stories - he excelled in his chosen category of Cabinetmaking in 1991, and followed this up with wins at National and International level in 1993. Since that time Scott has been a Regional and National Judge on several occasions, and now owns his own business, Zellers, in Asquith, Sydney, where he restores antique furniture.

Not only has Scott demonstrated his own prowess, he has been able to pass on his knowledge and experience to his own apprentice, Charles Smith. In a "first" for WorkSkill, Charles has followed in Scott's footsteps to win WorkSkill competitions at regional and national level, and went on to represent Australia in the 1997 International competition in St Gallen, Switzerland. To add to this success Charles recently completed his TAFE course with the highest overall marks.
